

Programme of Work

Land is at the heart of Scotland's identity, economy and communities. The Scottish Land Commission's role is to stimulate fresh thinking so that the way we own and use land in Scotland helps people to realise opportunities and ambitions.

Our Programme of Work sets out how we will deliver against our threeyear <u>Strategic Plan 2018-21</u>. We have committed to keeping our rolling Programme of Work up to date and this sets out the refreshed Programme as at June 2019. This Programme of Work will be kept under review on an annual basis. Our vision is a fair, inclusive and productive system of ownership, management and use of land that delivers greater benefit for all the people of Scotland.





Objectives

Our work over this three year period will be guided by three strategic objectives:



PRODUCTIVITY – To drive increased economic, social and cultural value from our land



DIVERSITY -

To encourage a more diverse pattern of land ownership with the benefits of land spread more inclusively



ACCOUNTABILITY -

To ensure decision-making takes account of those affected and responsibilities are met

Our Programme of Work continues to respond to the wider drivers setting the context for land reform, including:

Land Rights and Responsibilities – the Scottish Government's published Land Rights and Responsibilities Statement sets out a clear human rights-based framework for the rights and responsibilities associated with land ownership and use.

Community Empowerment – community ownership of land and assets is integral to empowered and resilient communities and should be much more normal across Scotland. The ability for communities to influence and benefit from decisions about land use is as important as ownership.

Inclusive Growth – the ability for individuals, businesses and communities to acquire, access and use the land they need is fundamental to a dynamic and productive economy that meets people's needs in a fair and inclusive way.

<u>A Land Use Strategy for Scotland</u> – this sets out a direction of travel towards a more integrated and strategic approach to land use, including assisting with measures to both mitigate and adapt to climate change.

The Programme sets out the major activities we currently intend to undertake, though is not a comprehensive list of all our expected or on-going work. The full scope of activity, associated resources and performance measures are set out in our annual business plans for each financial year.

Priorities

The Programme of Work is focused on four key areas covering both urban and rural land as set out in our Strategic Plan:

LAND FOR HOUSING AND DEVELOPMENT

Embedding transformational change to bringing vacant and derelict sites back into productive use, improve land supply for housing and stimulate a more active approach to developing land in the public interest.

MODERNISING LAND OWNERSHIP

Creating a diverse and dynamic pattern of land ownership in Scotland by making community ownership a normal option across Scotland, diversifying the pattern of private land ownership and further develop recommendations to addressing the issues associated with scale and concentration in ownership.

LAND USE DECISION-MAKING

Improving the quality and accountability of decision making and support land owners, managers and communities in meeting the expectations of Scotland's Land Rights and Responsibilities Statement and the Guidance on Engaging Communities in Decisions Relating to Land. Review key issues in relation to the influence of tax and fiscal policy in land use decision making.

AGRICULTURAL HOLDINGS

Increase access to land for those who want to farm, improve the relationships between landowners and tenant farmers and stimulate the tenant and joint ventures farming sector.
