

# Programme of Work

September 2023 – March 2025







Our Programme of Work sets out the planned work for the Scottish Land Commission to deliver on our Strategic Plan. The Land Reform (Scotland) Act 2016 requires the Commission to publish a Programme of Work and for it to be laid in Parliament.

Our Programme of Work takes an 18-month time horizon, and we expect to update it as required so that our work remains relevant and can respond to changing priorities within the period of the Strategic Plan. The delivery and resourcing arrangements in each financial year are set out in our annual business plans.
