Approaches to land use change and a just transition are important to our work. The Scottish Land Commission provides leadership, evidence and advice across three priority areas: reforming land rights, embedding responsible land ownership and use, and reforming land market. Our Strategic Plan 2023-26 sets a focus for our work on people, power and prosperity by 1) Enabling people to participate in and influence decisions about land 2) Diversifying the power and control in land ownership and governance 3) Using the value and benefits of land to create national economic prosperity. These aims and workstreams contribute to the delivery of just transition outcomes.
We engage a wide range of stakeholders across different sectors. We are involved in and convene several forums and groups including community land ownership, community benefits and tenant farming. The SLC is also a partner of the Natural Capital Communities Partnership – a collaboration between Community Land Scotland and the Cairngorms National Park- to help deliver wider benefits from land use change.
